*Died of Wounds 10 January 1915 aged 29*

***Personal History***

*Bernard DUNNE was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Thomas H. and Scally DUNNE nee SCARLE who were married 1881 at West Derby Register Office or Registrar Attended.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at Forts Brockhurst and Elson Barracks, Alkter Stoke, Gosport.. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Private.*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Empire Street, Liverpool,. He was aged 5 with the occupation of Scholar.*

*He was a married man. His wife's name was Katherine DUNNE (nee ALLEN) They married at St. Dunstan, Edge Hill Liverpool on 28 March 1905*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Hotel Refreshment Rooms at Liverpool as a House Porter*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Royal Welsh Fusiliers at Bootle. Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 14 September 1914. His last known address was Liverpool, Heath Street, 59 (Army Records).*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 10 January 1915 in 16th Field Ambulance Station aged 29*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star*
