Personal History

Percy John DUNNE was born at Chester, Cheshire in 1881 the son of William and Annie DUNNE nee HAYES who were married 1876 at St. Oswald, Chester. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 16, Fielding Street, Kennsington, Liverpool,. He was aged 30 with the occupation of Waiter at Family Hotel.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 19, Albion Street, Chester,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Postal Official.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 19, Albion Street, Chester,. He was aged 10 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Catharine DUNNE (nee SHALLCROSS) They married at St. Jude, Edge Hill, Liverpool on 20 March 1905. They had children: Mabel Phyllis b. 1907, Percy William b. 1911

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Washer

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at the same place.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 October 1917 aged 36

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
