Personal History

Paul ELLIS was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1889 the son of Thomas and Sarah Jane Ann ELLIS nee EDWARDS who were married 10/09/1866 at Manchester Cathedral. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 16, Turkey Lane, Queens Park, Manchester,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of A Warehouseman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 47, Hamilton Street, Collyhurst, Manchester,. He was aged 12

In the 1891 census the family were living at 49, Hamilton Street, Collyhurst, Manchester,. He was aged 2

He was a married man. His wife's name was Ethel ELLIS (nee GREGSON) They married at St. Stephen, Harpurhey, Manchester on 1 September 1912. They had children: Paul b. 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Oldham Road as a Lifter

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 24 September 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Queens Park, Turkey Lane, 16 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 29 August 1918 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
