Personal History

Harry EVANS was born at Wolverhampton, Staffordshire in 1893 the son of Emma EVANS.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Meols Cop as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Southport, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. on 7 September 1914 and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Orphon Street, Anne Square, 1 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 5 May 1916 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
