Personal History

Richard EVERETT was born at Everton, Liverpool in 1889 the son of Randal and Hannah EVERETT nee BATTERSBY who were married 1887 at St. Mary, Walton, Liverpool. His father died in 1916. His mother died in 1916.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 97, Cherry Lane, Walton, Liverpool,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Tobacco Manufacturer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 97, Cherry Lane, Walton, Liverpool,. He was aged 12 In the 1891 census the family were living at 19, Hayfield Street, Everton, Liverpool,. He was aged 2 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool as a Capstanman

Service History

He was living at Walton, Liverpool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool. on 22 March 1905 and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Walton, Cherry Lane, 97 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 May 1915 aged 26
