## Personal History

Martin FARAGHER was born at Bacup, Lancashire in 1882 the son of Patrick and Briget FARAGHER nee CONROY. His father died in 1892. His mother died in 1892.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 19, Hill Street, Bacup, Lancashire,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Builders Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 35, Blackwood Road, Bacup, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Stone Quarryman.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie FARAGHER (nee COLLIS) They married at Hyndburn Registry Office or Registar Atended on 16 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bacup as an Extra Porter

## Service History

He was living at Stacksteads, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bacup, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 August 1914 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
