Personal History

James FARRINGTON was born at Aintree, Liverpool in 1895 the son of James and Mary Elizabeth FARRINGTON nee BIRCH who were married 04/09/1893 at St. Peter and St. Paul, Ormskirk, Lancashire. His father died in 1945. His mother died in 1945.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Ealing Road, Aintree, Liverpool,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Railway Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 22, Ealing Road, Aintree, Liverpool,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Gerterude P. FARRINGTON (nee BURNET) They married at St. Mary, Kirkdale, Liverpool on 29 March 1905. They had children: Gertrude b. 1916

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Ormskirk as a Labourer

He was living at Aintree, Livepool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Scottish Regiment at Liverpool. Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 8 October 1916 in 10th Gen Hospital - Rouen aged 22 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
