Personal History

Orlando FARRINGTON was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1889 the son of William Smith and Elizabeth FARRINGTON.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 24, Cooper Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Iron Moulder.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 24, Cooper Road, Bolton, Lancashire. He was aged 10

He was a married man. His wife's name was Alice Ann FARRINGTON (nee HODGKINSON) They married at St. James the Apostle, Bolton on 1 January 1912. They had children: Elizabeth A. b. 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regt at Farnworth, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 22 June 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Folds Road, Burton Street, 9 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
