Killed in action 21 February 1916 aged 27

Personal History

Levi FEARNLEY was born at Cleckheaton, Yorkshire on 31 July 1888 the son of Alfred and Martha FEARNLEY nee FOWLER who were married 1872 at Bramley and Holbeck District Registered Building, Leeds. His father died in 1925. His mother died in 1925.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 18, Firth Road Old Lane, Beeston, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Stationers Packer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 30, Wesley Street, Beeston, Leeds,. He was aged 12

In the 1891 census the family were living at 28, Wesley Street, Beeston, Leeds,. He was aged 2

He was a married man. His wife's name was Evelin FEARNLEY (nee ROPER) They married at St. Mary, Beeston, Leeds on 2 July 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Wyre as an Extra Checker

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Regiment (West Yorkshire Regt.) at Leeds, Yorkshire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 21 February 1916 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
