Harry FERRIDAY was born at Donnington, Salop in 1889 the son of William and Emily FERRIDAY. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at Wharf Road, Gnosall Heath, Stafford,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Wharton Street, Ordsall, Retford, Nottinghamshire,. He was aged 13

In the 1891 census the family were living at Wood Street, Heath Town Wednesfield,. He was aged 2 He was a married man. His wife's name was Alice May FERRIDAY (nee WEBB) They married at Newport on 30 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 22 February 1919 in 54th Casualty Clearing Station, France aged 30 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
