Personal History

Enoch FIELDEN was born at Blackburn, Lancashire in 1889 the son of Richard Rigby and Hannah Elizabeth FIELDEN nee FIELDEN who were married 1891 at Blackburn Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1940. His mother died in 1940.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 13, Junction Street, Brierfield, Blackburn,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Bobbin Carrier in Cotton Card Room (Rigby).

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18. Sackville Street, Brierfield, Blackburn,. He was aged 12 (Rigby)

In the 1891 census the family were living at 30, Lowes Street, Blackburn,. He was aged 2

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Nelson as a Carter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Fleetwood, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 16 August 1914. His last known address was Burnley, Brierfield, Junsction Street, 13 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 1 November 1917 in 47th Casualty Clearing Station aged 28 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
