Personal History

Fred FIELDER was born at Todmorden, Yorkshire in 1891 the son of Henry and Jane FIELDER nee BALL who were married 21/12/1889 at St. John the Baptist, Halifax, Yorkshire. His father died in 1905. His mother died in 1905.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 1, Queens Court, Todmorden, Yorkshire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Motor Bus Conductor.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 9. Back Swan Place, Todmorden, Yorkshire,. He was aged 10 He was a married man. His wife's name was Nellie FIELDER (nee DEAN) They married at Cross Lanes Chapel, Hebden Bridge, Yorkshire on 21 March 1908. They had children: Nellie b.1910. Lily b. 1914 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Walsden as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Todmorden, Yorkshire. and embarked for Balkans on 22 July 1915. His last known address was Todmorden, Queens Court, 1 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
