Personal History

Albert Edward FINCH was born at Manchester, Lancashire on 13 January 1895 the son of John William and Ellen Charlotte FINCH nee WINTER who were married 1892 at St. Gabriel, Hulme, Manchester, Lancashire. In the 1911 census the family were living at 38, Newton Street, Gorton, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Hatters Furrier.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 47, Earl Street, Longsight, Manchester,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Lovcomotive Dept. at
Newton Heath as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the South Lancashire Fusiliers at the same place. on 5 September 1914 and embarked for France on 6 September 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Gorton, Newton Street, 38 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 19 September 1918 in 67th Field Ambulance - Greece aged 23 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
