Personal History

Samuel FITZPATRICK was born at Clayton-Le-Moors on 5 February 1898 the son of John and Elizabeth FITZPATRICK nee PARKINSON who were married 04/04/1891 at St. Paul, Burnley. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Old Sparth House, Clayton-Le-Moors,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Errand Boyand Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Amy Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Clayton-Le-Moors, Age 3.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Accrington as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the Kitcheners Army (Kings Own Lancaster) at Accrington, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 17 July 1915. His last known address was Accrington, Clayton (Le-Moors, Sparth Road, 60 - CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 20 July 1916 aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
