## Personal History

Joseph FLANNERY was born at Chadderton, Lancashire in 1884 the son of William and Alice Ann FLANNERY nee WILDE who were married 1875 at St. Margaret, Hollinwood. His father died in 1952. His mother died in 1952.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Clowes Street, Chadderton,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Cotton Operative.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 558, Manchester Road, Chadderton,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Cotton Mule Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 11, Clowes Street, Chadderton,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company

## Service History

He was living at Hollinwood, Oldham, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment. He is recorded as Died on 13 July 1916 in Sickness aged 33 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
