Personal History

Percy Henry FLETCHER was born at Bishops Castle, Ramsgate, Shropshire in 1880 the son of George and Emma FLETCHER nee COOPER who were married 1876 at Whitchurch, Shresbury, North Shropshire. His father died in 1929. His mother died in 1929.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 31, Ajax Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of Railway Goods Checker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Bull Street, Bishops Castle,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Ironmongers Assistant.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Market Square, Bishops Castle,. He was aged 10

He was a married man. His wife's name was Madeline FLETCHER (nee RICHARDSON) They married at St. Paul, Kirkdale, Liverpool on 5 August 1907. They had children: Ethel Mary Grace b. 1908, Mary Grace b. 1912, George Henry b. 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool Bankfield as a Checker

He was living at Walton, Liverpool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool.

He is recorded as Died at home on 28 July 1915 in Accidentally Drowned at Ramsgate aged 35
