## Personal History

Charles Jonathan FORD was born at Wivenhoe, Colchester in 1859 the son of Charles and Mary Ann FORD nee BARR who were married 05/09/1852 at St. Mary, Wivenhoe.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 45, Park Terrace, Goole,. He was aged 53 with the occupation of At sea.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Calder Square, Goole,. He was aged 43 with the occupation of Steam Ship Sailor.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Lower Bridge Stree, Hook, Goole,. He was aged 33 with the occupation of Not at Home At Sea.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sarah Ann FORD (nee BOULTON) They married at Wesleyan Chapel, Knottingley on 13 April 1883. They had children: Charles W. b.1884, Mary A. Elizabeth b. 1886, Martha L. b. 1889, Dorothy M, F. b. 1892, James A. b. 1894, Joseph B. b. 1898

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company

## Service History

He enlisted in the Mercantile Marine.

He is recorded as Died at sea on 6 May 1917 in Off Cap D'Antifer aged 59 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
