Personal History

George William FOULKES was born at Crewe, Cheshire on 17 May 1885 the son of George and Harriet FOULKES nee BEECH who were married 1883 at Nantwich Civil Marriage or Registrar Attended.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Middlewich Street, Crewe, Cheshire,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Labourer for Railway Company.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 4, Edward Street, Crerwe, Cheshire,. He was aged 5 He was a married man. His wife's name was Lucy FOULKES (nee HASSALL) They married at Christ Church, Crewe on 1 August 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a White Metaller

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Crewe, Cheshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 17 August 1914. His last known address was Crewe, Middlewich Street, 4 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 31 July 1918 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
