***Personal History***

*Arthur GARTSIDE was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1895 the son of John William and Mary GARTSIDE nee WILSON who were married 04 /02/1893 at St. Luke's, Miles Platting, Manchester. His father died in 1942. His mother died in 1942.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Magdala Street, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Errand Boy (Umbrellas).*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Market Place, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Florence GARTSIDE (nee LOUNT) They married at Sculcoates, Hull, Yorkshire on 31 March 1905*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Red Bank as a Gas Fitters Assistant*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire.*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 10 October 1918 in France aged 23*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal*
