

## Corporal Arthur GARTSIDE

21607 (6th)8th Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers Died of Wounds 10 October 1918 aged 23

## Personal History

Arthur GARTSIDE was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1895 the son of John William and Mary GARTSIDE nee WILSON who were married 04 /02/1893 at St. Luke's, Miles Platting, Manchester. His father died in 1942. His mother died in 1942.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Magdala Street, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Errand Boy (Umberellas).

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Market Place, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Florence GARTSIDE (nee LOUNT) They married at Sculcoates, Hull, Yorkshire on 31 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Red Bank as a Gas Fitters Assistant

## Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 10 October 1918 in France aged 23 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
