Personal History

Frederick Myddleton AXTON was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1888 the son of James Thomas and Catharine AXTON nee ROBERTS who were married 03/09/1885 at St. Paul, Kirkdale, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 112, Empress Road, Liverpool for Acton, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at West Hall Lodge, Crompton, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 12

In the 1891 census the family were living at 7, Holmfirth Road, Garston, Widnes, Lancashire. He was aged 3 He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie AXTON (nee OTES) They married at St. Anne, Stanley, Lancashire on 26 September 1914. They had children: John F. b. 1916, Kenneth J. b. 1919 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Old Swen, South Gate Road, 41 when he enlisted in the Royal Enginners at Liverpool, Lancashire. on 29 November 1915 and embarked for France on 16 February 1917. His last known address was Liverpool, Stoneycroft, Albany Road, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died on 13 February 1919 in Belmont Road Hospital, Liverpool aged 30 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
