Personal History

Joseph GEE was born at St. Helens, Lancashire in 1887 the son of Joseph and Ellen GEE nee WELDING who were married 30/11/1893 at St. Peters, Parr, St. Helems, Lancashire. His father died in 1908. His mother died in 1908.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 267, Park Road, St. Helens, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Glass Pusher.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 254, Park Road, St. Helend, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Colne as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 22 April 1915. His last known address was St. Helens, Park Road, 267 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 13 May 1915 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
