Personal History

James William GILL was born at Walton-Le-Dale, Lancashire in 1888 the son of George Henry and Margaret GILL nee CONNOR who were married 1887 at Preston Register Office or Registrar Attended. His mother died in 1889.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 64, Berry Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Bricksetters Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 28, Pleasant Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 13 In the 1891 census the family were living at 21, Pleasant Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 3 He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth Ellen GILL (nee DERBYSHIRE) They married at St. James's Church, Preston on 23 January 1910. They had children: Agnes b. 1911, Edith b. 1914, Hannah b. 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Preston as a Masons Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 17 July 1915. His last known address was Preston, Berry Street, 64 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 14 March 1916 in No. 7 Casualty Clearing Station aged 28 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
