### ***Personal History***

*Joseph Alfred GLEDHILL was born at Morley, Leeds, Yorkshire in 1899 the son of Luke and Rose GLEDHILL nee MEDLOCK who were married 1899 at St. Paul, Morley, Leeds, Yorkshire. His father died in 1965. His mother died in 1965.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 18, Leasowe Mount, Hunslet, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of Scholar.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 7, South Queen Street, Morley, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 2 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Signaller*

### ***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Northumberland Fusiliers. and embarked for France on 3 December 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Morley, Jackson Lane Booth's Buildings 54 (CWGC).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 August 1918 aged 19*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
