Personal History

John GLYNN was born at New Cross, Manchester in 1890 the son of Michael and Ann GLYNN nee CLYNES who were married 1889 at Manchester Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1950. His mother died in 1950.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 115, George Leigh Street, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Railway Worker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 99, Back Cropper Street, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 11

In the 1891 census the family were living at 72, Henry Street, New Cross, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 1

He was a married man. His wife's name was Gertrude Glynn GLYNN (nee THOMPSON) They married at Manchester Registry Office or Registar Atended on 25 March 1905. They had children: Gertrude b. 1912, John b. 1913, Michael Alexander b. 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Oldham as a Pointsman

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of illness on 11 October 1917 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
