Personal History

Alfred GRANGE was born at Manchester, Lancashire on 27 February 1892 the son of John Henry and Nelie GRANGE nee AYKROYD who were married 27/03/1890 at St. Luke, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died in 1900. His mother died in 1900.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 63, Stapleton Street, Irlam O'th' Heights, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Railway Train Booker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 32, Fleetwood Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Pendlebury as a Signaller

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 18 November 1915. His last known address was Salford, Irlam O' th' Heights, Stapleton Street, 63 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 August 1918 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
