Personal History

Thomas James GREAVES was born at Fazakerley, Liverpool in 1889 the son of Thomas James and Martha Agnes GREAVES nee BADLEY who were married 24/04/1876 at St. Peter, Liverpool, Lancashire. His father died in 1944. His mother died in 1944.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34, Waterworks Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Ham Preserver and Bacon Curer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 1, Dalibury Road, Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 12 In the 1891 census the family were living at 2 in 7, Great Richmond Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 2

He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Jane GREAVES (nee FULLARD) They married at St. Leonards, Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire on 18 December 1910

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Fazakerley as a Watchman

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 September 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Waterworks Street, 34 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1916 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
