Personal History

Albert BAGSHAW was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1894 the son of John Frederick and Agnes BAGSHAW nee ALLEN who were married 29/03/1890 at St. Luke Miles Platting, Manchester.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Garrett Street, Newton, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Railway Letter Sorter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Brunswick Place, Manchester,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Manchester (Letter Despatch Off.

Service History

He enlisted in the King's (Liverpool) Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 31 May 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Lower Crumpsall, Mount Pleasant, 12 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 24 March 1918 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
