Personal History

Fred GREENHALGH was born at Swinton, Lancashire on 1 February 1898 the son of Joseph and Emily GREENHALGH nee CLOUGH who were married 28/01/1877 at Christ Church, Pendlebury, Lancashire. His father died in 1941. His mother died in 1941.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Cemetery Road, Swinton, Lancashire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of A Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Brackley Street, Swinton, Lancashire,. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died on 30 October 1918 in Prisoner of War - Germany aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal

Grave Inscription "DEARLY LOVED". March 1918 Taken Prisoner on the Somme. Died 7 Months Later
