Personal History

John Robert GREENHALGH was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1889 the son of Robert and Annie GREENHALGH.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Bamber Steet, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 8, Roundcroft Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 He was a married man. His wife's name was Ellen GREENHALGH (nee GROGORY) They married at Emmanuel Parish Church, Bolton, Lancashire on 25 March 1905. They had children: Thomas G.b. 1912, Robert b. 1913, Alice b. 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bolton as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Bolton, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 31 July 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Bamber Street, 22 (!911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 August 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
