Personal History

Thomas GREENHALGH was born at Little Lever, Bolton, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Albert Edward and Mary Ellen GREENHALGH nee COWBURN who were married 13/05/1893 at St. John The Evangelist, Farnworth & Kearsley. His father died in 1926. His mother died in 1926.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 24, Balmoral Road, Farnworth, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Fustation Weaver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 199, Worsley Road, Little Bolton. Lancashire,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Salford as a Painters Labourer

Service History

He was living at Farnworth, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Shropshire Light Infantry at Bury, Lancashire. on 1 August 1914 and embarked for France on 10 February 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Farnworth, Albert Street, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 22 September 1918 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
