He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Oldham, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans? on 5 May 1915. His last known address was Oldham, Freeman Styreet, 11 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 June 1915 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
