Personal History

James GREGORY was born at Workington, Cumberland (Down Ireland) in 1886 the son of Peter and Mary GREGORY nee O'HARE.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Pinfold Street, Workington,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Banks Lane, Workington, Cumberland,. He was aged 5
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers
Dept. at Blackburn as an Extra Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Border Regiment at Workington, Cumberland. and embarked for France on 26 November 1914. His last known address was Blackburn, Mannor Sutton Street, 4 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 December 1914 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
