Nicholas GREGORY was born at Workington, Cumberland in 1890 the son of Peter and Mary GREGORY nee O'HARE.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Pinfold Street, Workington,. He was aged 11 In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Banks Lane, Workington, Cumberland,. He was aged 1 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Blackburn as a Shunter

## Service History

He was living at Blackburn, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Border Regiment at Workington, Cumberland. and embarked for France on 4 January 1915. His last known address was Blackburn, Mannor Sutton Street, 4 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 6 August 1915 in Calais aged 25 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
