Personal History

Joseph Crookes GRIME was born at Chorlton-Cum-Hardy, Manchester on 18 September 1897 the son of Joseph Crookes Grime J.P. MBE and Florence Mary GRIME nee HALL who were married 19/08/1896 at St. Matthew, Stretford, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died in 1923. His mother died in 1923.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18, Regent Road, Chorlton-cum-Hardy, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 3

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 March 1918 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
