Personal History

Arthur GRUNDY was born at Salford, Lancashire in 1882 the son of William and Sara A. GRUNDY.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 21, Rigby Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 30 with the occupation of Grain Elevator Man.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Weaver Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Machine Minder.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sarah Elizabeth GRUNDY (nee BUSBY) They married at Chorlton-cum-Hardy Registry Office or Registrar Atended on 14 March 1905. They had children: Mary Elizabeth b. 1902

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company at Horwich as a Labourer

Service History

He was living at Hulme, Manchester when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Salford, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 02/06.1915. His last known address was Salford, Rigby Street, 21 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 4 June 1915 in Gallipoli aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
