Personal History

Charles GRUNDY was born at Blackburn, Lancashire in 1887 the son of Charles and Margaret GRUNDY nee ALLEN who were married 30/05/1868 at St. Peter, Blackburn, Lancashire. His father died in 1936. His mother died in 1936.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Brookhouse Lane, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Cotton Mill Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 17, Brookhouse Lane, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Cotton Mill Doffer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 37, Cambridge Street, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Blackburn as an Extra Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment at Blackburn, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 4 September 1914. His last known address was Blackburn, Brookhouse Lane, 17 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 20 October 1915 in H.S. Dover Castle aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
