Ernest HAGAN was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1892 the son of Thomas and Sarah Ann HAGAN nee HOOLEY who were married 1891 at Manchester Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1964. His mother died in 1964.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 28, Spenser Street, Goole, Yorkshire.. He was aged 9
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Engineers Dept.
at Miles Platting as a Ballastman

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 26 July 1915. His last known address was Openshaw, Ahton Old Road, Brunswick Street, 9 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 August 1917 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
