Personal History

Frank BAILEY was born at Oldham Lancashire in 1881 the son of Alfred and Emma BAILEY nee HYDEN who were married 1877 at St. Thomas, Stockport.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 71, West End Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 29 with the occupation of Gen Engineering in Iron Foundry.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11 Burnley Lane, Chadderton, Oldham,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Cotton Manufacturing.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 128, Busk Old Road, Chadderton, Oldham,. He was aged 9

He was a married man. His wife's name was Martha Ann BAILEY (nee TIDESWELL) They married at St. Matthew, Chadderton on 13 June 1908. They had children: Norman b. 1910

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. as a Reserve Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 27 August 1915. His last known address was Oldham, West End Street, 71 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 8 November 1916 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
