Personal History

Thomas HALLIGAN was born at Sheffield, Yorkshire in 1871 the son of Daniel and Catherine HALLIGAN nee RAFFERTY. His mother died in 1913.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 25, Hartley Street, Nelson, Lancashire,. He was aged 38 with the occupation of Paviours General Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 5 Court 2H, Lee Croft, Sheffield, Yorkdhire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Cutler.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie HALLIGAN (nee PRICE) They married at Leeds on 24 December 1904. They had children: Nellie Price b.1896, Joseph Price b.1901, John Edward b. 1908, Francis b. 1910

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Nelson as a Sheeter

Service History

He was living at 25, Hartley Street, Nelson when he enlisted in the York and Lancaster Regiment at Nelson, Lancashire. on 21 December 1914 and embarked for France on 18 March 1915. His last known address was Nelson, Kendal Street, 41 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 July 1915 aged 41

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
