Personal History

James Henry HALSALL was born at Lathom, Lancashire in 1890 the son of William Fairhurst and Jane Ellen HALSALL nee MARSDEN who were married 1883 at Ormskirk Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1942. His mother died in 1942.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 72, Burligton Crescent, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Tube Cleaner at Raiklway Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Mill Lane Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Lathom, Lancashire, Age 11.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Mill Lane Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Lathom, Lancashire, Age 1.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Goole as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole. Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 13 April 1915. His last known address was Liverpool. Everton, Dacy Road (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 19 June 1915 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
