Personal History

Samuel HARDAKER was born at Bacup, Lancashire in 1883 the son of James and Margaret HARDAKER nee BOYLE. His mother died in 1905.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 52, Market Street, Witworth, Lancashire,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Sautcher in Cotton Mill.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2, Higher Hemfields,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Bertha HARDAKER (nee GLEDHILL) They married at St. John, Facit, Lancashire on 3 November 1906. They had children: Samuel b. 1908, Edith Emma b. 1910 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Storekeeper

Service History

He enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment. and embarked for Balkans on 1 August 1915. His last known address was Rochdale, Shawforth, Peel Terrace, 474 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died at home on 18 November 1919 aged 36

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
