Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Radcliffe (New) as a Signaller

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 8 November 1917 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
