Personal History

John James HARDWICK was born at Leeds, Yorkshire on 14 November 1892 the son of Harry and Martha Elizabeth HARDWICK nee STEPHENSON who were married 07/04/1890 at St. Clement, Sheepscar, Leeds, Yorkshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, New Cleveland Row, Newtown, Leeds, Yorkshire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Bricklayers Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 19, Folly Lane, Hunslet, Leeds. Yorkshire,. He was aged 8

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Leeds as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Leeds, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 16 April 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Newtown, New Cleveland Row, 2 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 July 1916 in France aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
