Personal History

Harry BAILLIE was born at Bramhall, Cheshire in 1896 the son of Walter and Sarah Ann BAILLIE nee FODDY who were married 1892 at Chorlton-on-Medlock, Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1915. His mother died in 1915.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 14, Bush Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2, St. Augustine Street, Harpurhay. Mancgester,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Railway Clerk

He enlisted in the Royal Army Service Corp.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 9 August 1919 in 24th General Hospital, France aged 23 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
