Personal History

Robert HARDY was born at Salford, Lancashire in 1885 the son of William and Ellenor HARDY nee BOULLEN who were married 1881 at St. James, Higher Broughton, Salford, Lancashire. His mother died in 1918.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 222, Conran Street, Harpurhey, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Railway Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 40, Mary Street, Broughton, Salford,. He was aged 5
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the
Line Dept. at Miles Platting as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 19 September 1914. His last known address was Harpurhey, Conran Street, 222 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 November 1914 in Home aged 29 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
