Personal History

James HARLING was born at Newton, Manchester in 1881 the son of James and Elizabeth HARLING nee ASHLEY who were married 06/11/1880 at St. Philip, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1891 census the family were living at 135, Butterworth Street, Bradford, Manchester, LaNCASHIRE,. He was aged 10 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Lilian Emily HARLING (nee QUICK) They married at Christ Church, Bradford, Manchester, Lancashire on 18 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath Shops as a Pattern Maker

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 6 May 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Beswick, Ahton New Road, 206 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 4 June 1915 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
