Personal History

William HARLING was born at Chorley, Lancashire in 1880 the son of John and Ellenor HARLING nee MORRIS who were married 24/12/1870 at St. Lawrence Chorley, Lancashire. His father died on .

He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Alice HARLING (nee LESFORD) They married at St. Lawrence, Chorley, Lancashire on 3 August 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Chorley

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Chorley, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Chorley, Springs Road, 22

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 June 1915 aged 35

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
