Personal History

Arthur HARMON was born at Radcliffe, Lancashire on 22 December 1891 the son of Richard and Mary Alice HARMON nee AINSWORTH who were married 1880 at Bury Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1918. His mother died in 1918.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Wellington Barracks, Bolton Road, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Private.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Shuttle Street, Radcliffe, Lancashire,. He was aged 8
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers
Dept. at Radcliffe as an Extra Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 8 October 1915 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
