Personal History

Charles William ALCOCK was born at Hook, Yorkshire in 1889 the son of Eli and Elizabeth ALCOCK nee TOMLINSON who were married 1875 at Goole.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Freemans Buildings, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Bricklayer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Freemans Buildings, Goole Yorkshire,. He was aged 12

In the 1891 census the family were living at Freemans Buildings, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 2

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Labourer

Service History

He was living at Goole, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Worcestershire Regiment at the same place. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 22 July 1915. His last known address was Goole, Freemans Building, 12 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 October 1917 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
